


Overview of Methodology

- Volunteering at youth drop-in centre
- Data Collection:
 - 24 interviews with young people
 - 2 focus groups with young people
 - 3 focus groups with service providers
 - 4 interviews with service providers
- Total Participants: 60 people
 - 35 young people
 - 25 service providers
- Reporting back to young people



Sample Characteristics


Length of Homelessness Experienced by Sample (n=24)


Ages of Sample (n=24)






Positive Victimology


- Focus on strengths and resilience [1]










Deficits vs. Strengths
