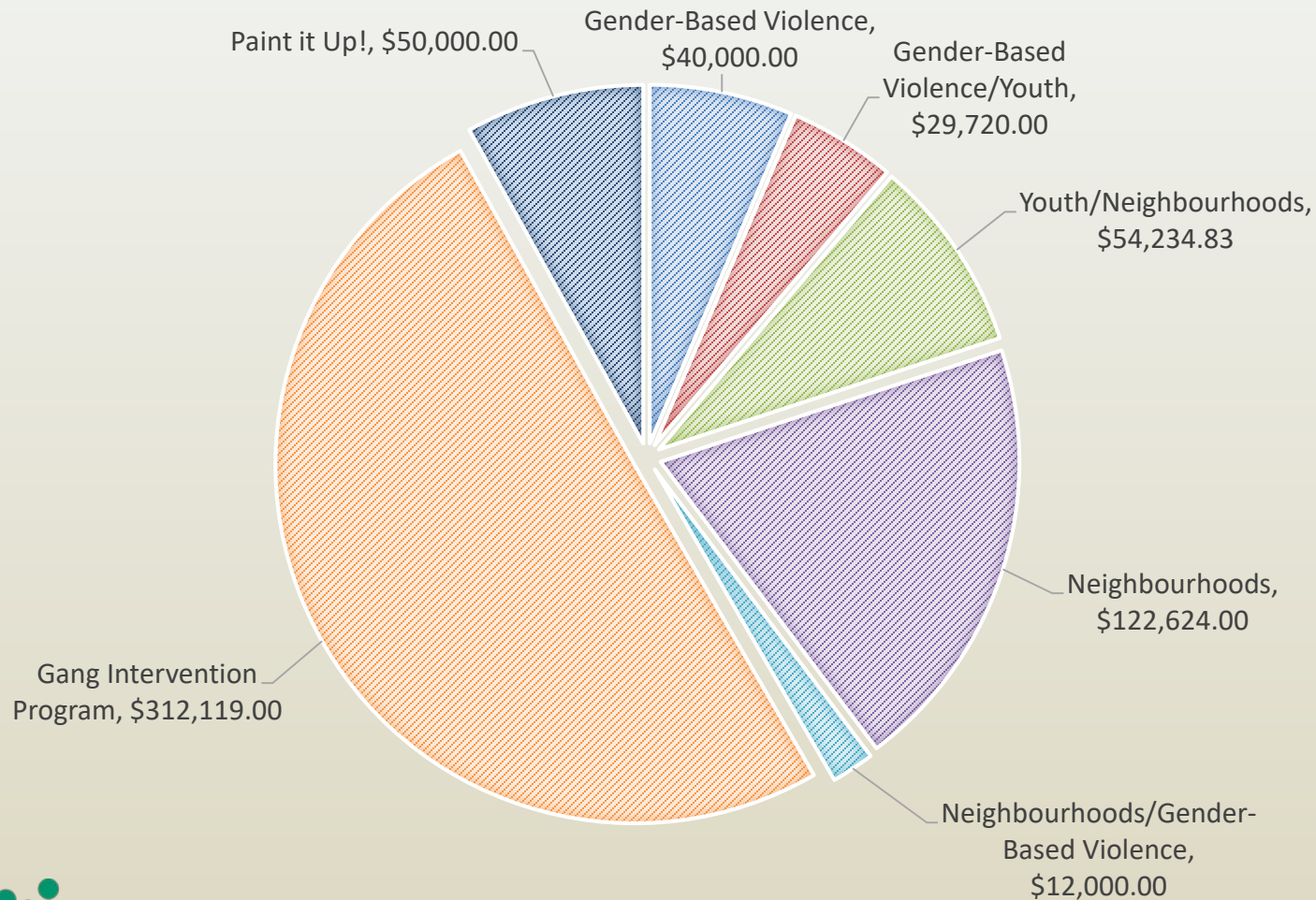

- » OCAPDD, community health centre staff, and residents delivered training for OPS call takers

Building Capacity

- » Youth-police dialogues continue to build skills and understanding
- » Invested in a ~\$4k strategic plan for Lowertown and helped secure a \$70k grant
- » Trauma-informed training

- » Report on violent- and weapons-crime in the City of Ottawa from 2012-2016
- » Home takeover tools and templates
- » Refreshed our Ottawa Street Violence and Gang Strategy
